



Year 4 Curriculum Newsletter – Spring 1st Half Term



This half term in Year 4, children will be exploring a wide range of topics, from the Ancient Romans in history to changes in pitch, tempo and dynamics in music. They will draw on their prior knowledge to deepen understanding and make meaningful links across the curriculum.

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| <u>MATHS</u> This half term, children will strengthen their multiplication and division skills, explore fractions and equivalents, and measure and convert units including perimeter. | <u>ENGLISH</u> This half term, children will explore mystery and detective stories, reading <i>William and the Missing Masterpiece</i> , and write newspaper recounts based on <i>William Goes to Hollywood</i> . |
| <u>SCIENCE</u> In science this half term, Children will learn about electrical appliances, circuits, conductors, and how electricity is generated and used. | <u>COMPUTING</u> In Computing this half term, children will learn about loops and repetition in programming, creating shapes and patterns using Logo. |
| <u>HISTORY</u> This half term, children will learn how the Romans shaped Britain and explore their lasting impact on the country today. | <u>GEOGRAPHY</u> This half term, children will learn about rainforests, their climate, layers, importance, deforestation, and how they compare to the UK. |
| <u>MUSIC</u> This half term, children will sing in tune and harmony, explore musical feelings, create and perform ostinatos, and work together in group performances. | <u>PHYSICAL EDUCATION</u> This half term, children will develop physical and dance skills, work with others, and take part in competitive and co-operative activities. |
| <u>ART / DT</u> This half term, children will mix tints and shades in Art and design and make and evaluate working torches in Design Technology. | <u>R.E</u> This half term, children will explore Hindu Dharma, learning about Brahman, Hindu stories, texts, and how deities reflect its qualities. |
