Current is how much electricity is flowing round a circuit. When current flows through wires heat is released. The greater the current, the more heat is released</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>COMPUTING</u> Introduction into spreadsheets. This unit introduces the learners to spreadsheets. They will be supported in organising data into columns and rows to create their own data set.</p>

Consider how the adoption of Fairtrade can positively impact local communities in their socio-economic development.</p>

We will discover how rhythms can be 'translated' onto different instruments, including body percussion, inspired by artwork from the Pop Art era.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>PHYSICAL EDUCATION</u> Gym Perfecting Which Quadrant Dodgeball</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>ART / DT</u> Art – Artist study. We will use sketchbooks to research and present information, develop ideas into a plan for a final piece, make a personal response to the artwork of another artist and use different methods to analyse artwork such as drama, discussion and questioning. DT – Automata toys. We will experiment with a range of cams, creating a design for an automata toy.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>R.E</u> What difference does the resurrection make to Christians? Pupils will study the 'big story' of the Bible, explaining the place of incarnation and salvation. They will study accounts of Jesus' death and resurrection comparing their thoughts with the different ways that Christians may interpret these texts.</p>
