<p style="text-align: center;"><u>MATHS</u></p> <p>In Maths, we will be continuing our work on the four operations and the order of operations, including brackets. We will then move on to fractions: equivalent, comparing, adding and subtracting, multiplying and dividing fractions. We will then end the term with imperial and metric measures.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>ENGLISH</u></p> <p>Lost Happy Endings by Carol Anne Duffy We will be creating our own narrative based on this story and a set of instructions.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>SCIENCE</u></p> <p>In Science, pupils will be looking at 'Evolution and Inheritance'. Pupils will look at fossils to explore how animals have changed over time. They will understand how offspring of different animals are similar but not identical to their parents, compare environmental and inherited characteristics and look at adaptations.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>COMPUTING</u></p> <p>Learners will develop their knowledge and understanding of using a computer to produce 3D models. Learners will initially familiarise themselves with working in a 3D space, moving, resizing, and duplicating objects. They will then create hollow objects using placeholders and combine multiple objects to create a model of a desk tidy.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>HISTORY</u></p> <p>Our topic this term is WWI. The children have contributed their own interests which have shaped the unit. We will be looking at why the war started, who was involved, life in the trenches, the role of women, how animals were used and how the war impacted on our locality.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>GEOGRAPHY</u></p> <p>We will be studying our local area and the United Kingdom. We will be looking at features of cities elsewhere in the world and comparing them to Culcheth.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>MUSIC</u></p> <p>In Music we will explore how different styles of music contribute to the feel of a film in our topic 'Film Music'</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>PHYSICAL EDUCATION</u></p> <p>In PE we will be looking further into invasion games, including football and netball. We will be looking at Street Dance in our indoor PE.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>ART / DT</u></p> <p>Art - Drawing: Expressing my ideas. We will identify key features of street art and murals, discuss the intention and impact of street art and use various techniques to show texture, tone, form and depth. DT - We will be joining different materials together to design and create a worry monster for our reception buddy.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>R.E</u></p> <p>"Why do Christians believe that Jesus was the Messiah?" In this unit, pupils explore the concept of the Messiah within Christian belief, examining its origins, significance, and the reasons why Christians see Jesus as the fulfilment of ancient promises.</p>
